Artist's Statement

Good Morning, Midnight creates an environment where each character's actions or thoughts are intense and introspective. Whether it is Augustine or Sully, they consistently ponder over regrets, fears, or hopes. In my artwork, I am responding to what connects these two characters – the power of memory, and the desire to persevere. The child figure represents Sully and Iris, since both are left to Augustine's imagination. This allows him to cope with his decision to stay behind, and rationalize the distance between Sully, in the vastnesses of space, and Iris, in the desolate Arctic landscape. I incorporated lined paper and text because some part of me believes Augustine was journaling his adventures with Iris as a way to maintain his sanity.
