#### **Book Summary**

Spare Parts is the true story of four Latino teenagers who arrive at the Marine Advanced Technology Education Robotics Competition at the University of California, Santa Barbara. They were born in Mexico but raised in Phoenix, Arizona, where they attended an underfunded public high school. No one had ever suggested to Oscar, Cristian, Luis, or Lorenzo that they might amount to much, but two inspiring science teachers had convinced these impoverished, undocumented kids from the desert who had never even seen the ocean that they should try to build an underwater robot.

Josh covered the Iraq war for Wired Magazine, where he is a Contributing Editor. Josh's work has thrice been selected Best of Technology Writing by Yale University Press and has also been anthologized in the 2007 and 2012 editions of Best American Science Writing.
