# First Salem Reads... A Great Success

In February 2017, over 4000 people enjoyed the programing at the first ever Salem Reads with a robot expo, movies, book give away, conversations and an author visit. Watch for Salem Reads again in February 2018.

For those who don't know, Salem Reads is a community reading program that invites everyone to read the same book, take part in discussions on the themes of that book, and enjoy related programs during the month of February. The chosen title in 2017 was *Spare Parts*, by Joshua Davis, the true story of four Latino teenagers born in Mexico but raised in Phoenix, Arizona, where they attended an underfunded public high school. Encouraged by excellent teachers, they entered an underwater robotics competition and beat MIT!

As our dedicated group of volunteers selects the book for Salem Reads 2018, we remain committed to sharing a book that allows us to invite and include the entire community by offering thought provoking conversation and programming, education about our neighbors, and the strong connection and enjoyment that can come to all ages by reading a good book. We hope you will join us!



# Library Support Boards Demystified

The Salem Public Library has three independent support boards all enhancing the work of the Library in their own special ways. They are the Friends of the Salem Public Library (Friends), Salem Library Advisory Board (LAB), and the Salem Public Library Foundation (Foundation). Each has a board and provides specific financial and support services to the Library.

Friends of the Library is a membership organization that raises funds for youth and other programs with the proceeds from book sales and from their store located on the main floor of the Library. They do the heavy lifting of Library support as they accept donations of books from the public and are the recipient of library books as they are retired from the collection. The Friends have been a great supporter of the Foundation's efforts on projects like Salem Reads. Over the years they have made significant contributions to the Children's library and Teen Scene remodels. In FY 16-17 Friends provided \$31,000 to library programs.

LAB acts in an advisory capacity to the Salem City Council on the operation of the Library. Members are appointed to

four year terms by the Council and steward Trust and Agency funds dedicated to Library use. Recently, LAB has supported the Foundation's work by granting over \$43,000 to the Gehlar Reading Room Project to match the Foundation's contribution, and they gave \$5,000 in support of Salem Reads in 2017.

The Salem Public Library Foundation provides enhancements to the Library by writing grants and raising funds from individuals and businesses to support our work. Over the years, many projects have been funded by generous donors in the form of gifts, in kind gifts and including the Foundation in personal wills and trusts. Projects completed have been the Teen Scene, Anderson Room and Children's library remodels. Current projects include Salem Reads and the Gehlar Reading Room. In FY16-17 the Foundation provided \$47,000 to library programs.

Together we advocate and raise awareness for the Library.

The Foundation is proud to have strong partners in helping make the Salem Public Library such a special place in our community.

# Library Art News

You may not know the Salem Public Library Foundation and the City maintain significant art collections. Our mutually held goal is to provide the general public an opportunity to view quality artwork free of charge in public buildings and other spaces. The City's art is managed by the Salem Public Art Commission (SPAC).

This summer the Foundation Art Committee is partnering with SPAC in evaluating and rehanging each group's Library holdings. David Wilson, the Galley Director at Salem Art Association has joined our team to curate the project.

As you watch the rehanging take place in the Library, look for new pieces by prominent Northwest Artists. Last December, the Foundation received a tremendous gift of art from a generous Portland donor. The gift included works from Manuel Izquierdo, Charles Heaney, Carl Morris, Jack McLarty and Don Wilson, whose "Mother and Child" sculpture has been placed just outside the Heritage Room on the main floor.

In other art news, recently, the Foundation Art Committee happily honored Mayor Bennett's request to borrow two pieces of Foundation artwork to be featured in the Mayor's office. He requested "Willamette Valley" by Carl Hall and "Green Grass River" by Sue-Del McCulloch, both pastoral valley scenes. These items were installed in late April with the aid and expertise of the Salem Public Art Commission's talented members.

You can ask your attorney or accountant about the potential tax benefits for you and your family of including charitable organizations in your will or trust. We hope you will consider including the Foundation in your plans.
